1 ORCA CARE & RESEARCH

Meet-the-Expert Area



The powerful and majestic killer whale is the largest animal in our care. This is your opportunity to speak directly with a behaviorist and learn the facts about Orcinus orca.

By visiting this area you'll learn:

- · How whales participate in their own health care
- The importance of orca enrichment and play
- The many ways our whale research is helping whales in the wild

2 ANIMAL HEALTH & RESCUE CENTER

Special Access Behind-The-Scenes Area

A visit here includes:

- Tour the animal hospital, laboratory, and rescue center
- Learn how our veterinarians make "house" calls and take "office" visits
- See how we feed 16,000 animals each day
- See how we x-ray a bird or get blood samples from a dolphin



SeaWorld is privileged to rescue and return hundreds of ill, injured and stranded animals each year.

- Learn what we do from rescue to intake, critical care, quarantine and recovery
- Discover what impacts humans are having on wildlife
- Be inspired to make simple changes that can positively affect the environment

Explorer's Reef is home to a variety of marine life in diverse environments. Aquarists maintain both saltwater and freshwater habitats, meet a diverse set of dietary needs, and maintain optimum water quality and temperature for all the fish, sharks and crabs in their care.

7 SHARK FEEDING & CONSERVATION

Aquarists will introduce you to the world of the often misunderstood shark. This up-close experience includes observing an actual shark feeding.

- Ever wonder how we maintain healthy diets for all our sharks?
- Just how do aquarists stay safe during feeding and cleaning activities?
- What is shark finning and how is it impacting wild shark populations?

Visit this area and you'll come away with a new understanding and greater appreciation for this ocean predator.

Bird Rescue & Conservation

San Diego is home to many endangered bird species and SeaWorld actively participates in a breeding and reintroduction program. A team of aviculturists will introduce several feathered friends and discuss Species Survival Plans. You will get to visit the Oiled Wildlife Care Center, home of our Bird Rescue Program.

Our Water Systems

The animals in our care reside in more than 13 million gallons of fresh and salt water. Each species receives just what it needs in water quality and temperature through the complex system of treatment plants, filters and heating/cooling elements. A team of water quality professionals work around the clock testing water, cleaning pools and monitoring systems to ensure habitats stay clear and comfortable for all the animals.

HOW CAN YOU HELP?

WHAT TO DO IF YOU SEE A STRANDED ANIMAL

- Do not touch, pick up, feed, or pour water on the animal.
- Watch the animal from at least 50 feet away.
 It is not unusual for some animals to rest out of the water, on sand or rocks.
- Take note of details such as the exact location of the animal, physical characteristics, and the condition.
- If you are sure the animal needs help, notify SeaWorld or another authorized animal rescue organization, a lifeguard, park ranger, or animal control.
